
OASIS 34 (JULY – DECEMBER 2021): “THE GLOBAL SOUTH AND THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW WORLD ORDER”

The Observatory for the Analysis of International Systems (OASIS), an indexed and peer-reviewed journal, launches the call for papers for a special edition on **“THE GLOBAL SOUTH AND THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW WORLD ORDER”**.

During the past few years, the International System has undergone a major shift in its power structures, perhaps the largest in history. Former superpowers like the United Kingdom and France are losing influence in the world while, at the same time, give way to emerging countries of the Global South such as China, India, or Brazil. This process is so evident that even the role of the United States as the only superpower is questioned with the emergence of China and Russia.

However, beyond the recent positioning of powerful actors from the Global South like Russia, China, India or Brazil, lays a group of smaller, yet increasingly important countries that have started to actively influence the decision-making process in the world. Moreover, even if they do not wish to – or cannot - become superpowers or alter the rules of the International System radically, they are keen to alter the current power relations structure and increase their influence in the world. As part of this category of emerging powers from the Global South are South Africa, Indonesia, Mexico, Vietnam, South Korea, Nigeria, Turkey, Egypt, Colombia, and Algeria, amongst others.

In consequence, taking into account the increasing importance of the Global South in the International System, the 34th edition of OASIS launches its call for papers in order to receive articles on four main topics: **alternative narratives and understandings on the International System as seen from the Global South; the international agenda of the Global South; global and regional governance in the Global South; and main and secondary regional powers in the Global South.**

The editors that have been invited for this number of OASIS are **Lía Rodríguez de la Vega, PhD** (Argentinean Council for International Relations and Universidad Nacional de Lomas de Zamora, Argentina); **Jerónimo Delgado Caicedo, PhD** and **Lina María Luna Beltrán, PhD (C)** (Universidad Externado de Colombia).

INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS:

- Articles must be written in Spanish, English, French or Portuguese.
- Articles submitted to OASIS may not have been published previously.
- Articles must be written in Microsoft Word. The maximum length of the articles must be 9,000 (nine thousand) words, single space, Font Arial 12, 2.5 cms top and bottom margins and 3.0 cms left and right margins. It must include a reference list, notes, pictures, or graphs if needed.
- References must have APA format, which can be found at: <http://www.apastyle.org/learn/quick-guide-on-references.aspx#Websites>

- The author must include an abstract in English, Spanish and the original language of the article (in case it is different from Spanish and English). The abstract must include the key elements of the article and must not be longer than two hundred and fifty (250) words. Four to Five key words must also be included.
- The author must include: last academic title, field of research, institutional affiliation, and e-mail.
